



- Notification was made in the NYHEP Announcement section and the Program Announcement on 2/22/24.
- Minor updates to permissions were added to include required data sharing with the Department of Public Service as they regulate the work that NYSERDA does and the U.S. Department of Energy in preparation of the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) funding

## **Requirements for "Package B"**

#### • Meeting all measures for "Package A" and....

- > Adding insulation to exterior gable end walls and knee walls
- > Above grade walls already meeting minimum requirement of R-14
- Floors above unconditioned insulated to program requirements (R-30 Zone 5 and 6, R-19 Zone 4)
  - The result is an increased thermal boundary and a higher incentive to the customer

- We understand the amount of square footage to be insulated in the situation of either gable end walls or knee walls may not be substantial.
- Regardless, if modeled in this manner the project will now be eligible for package B incentives
- Be specific in the proposed improvement description

## **QA Inspections Are Ramping Up**

- Previously: QA Inspections was primarily focused on "Provisional" Contractors (new to Comfort Home) to help contractors earn 3 passing scores to be promoted to "Full" status.
- Now: NYSERDA is ramping up to a 10% inspection rate of all Comfort Home jobs including those installed by "Full" status contractors.
- Why?: This new 10% inspection rate aligns with best practices and with the EmPower+ Program.
- > How?: The QA inspection process will be remaining the same.

### **New Utility Release Form**

> Updates Includes:

- Utility account number and POD length/format chart at bottom of page 1
- Form-fillable and electronic signing
- Same requirements apply
  - Must be signed and dated by customer
  - All customer information must be provided
  - All Utility Information must be provided
  - Uploaded to SharePoint only
- This form can be used for REA as well

#### RELEASE FORM Residential Energy Efficiency



To be eligible to participate in New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) residential energy efficiency programs, you must complete and sign this form.

Your signature authorizes NYSERDA, and its agents, to access the project reports, 24 months of pre-project and 36 months of postproject energy usage data from utilities and energy providers. Data will be accessed through Electronic Data Interchange (EDI), Green Button, or other electronic means and will be used in determining program eligibility, estimating energy savings, program implementation, and evaluation, including the evaluation of achieved energy savings.

To qualify for participation, you need to meet these requirements:

- 1. You must be the owner, or be authorized to sign for the owner, of a 1-4 unit residential property in New York State.
- You must be a current electric customer of Consolidated Edison of New York, Inc. (Con Ed), New York State Electric and Gas Corporation (NYSEG), Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation (RG&E), Central Hudson Gas and Electric Corporation, Orange and Rockland (O&R), or National Grid.

**Pricing Updates** 

### Fuel Rate and Measure Pricing Update

EmPower+ measure pricing and Program fuel rates were updated and posted on the <u>Contractor</u> <u>Support</u> website. They became effective as of February 23, 2024.

Measure pricing updates reflected changes to several variables including national inflation and consumer price index (CPI) data, and market price research. The updated list can be found in Section 5.5 of the **Program Manual** on the **Contractor Support site**.

For Program fuel rates, natural gas and electricity rates were based on the Joint Utilities 2021-2023 SC1 3year average. Delivered fuels were based upon the NYSERDA New York Home Pricing Monitoring Program 2022-2023 averages. For cost-effectiveness calculations, NYSERDA used volumetric charges including supply (commodity), transmission and distribution, and other charges applied based on the supply volume. Updated fuel rates can be found in Section 5.12 of the <u>Program Manual</u>.

The NY Home Energy Portal (NYHEP) was updated and is effective for new projects initially submitted for Workscope Approval on or after February 23, 2024. NYSERDA finance has also updated their Proforma tool to reflect the updated fuel pricing.

# How to Manage Availability to New Customers

### **EmPower+ Customer Acceptance**

Contractors should reach out to Contractor Support to pause or restart their customer assignments if they are unable to serve the customer in a timely manner. This is beneficial as it:

- prevents repeated rejections by contractors
- contractor reassignments by Program
- reduces customer concerns that occur due to lengthy delays

CLEAResult will be reaching out to review and manage Contractor enrollments, with a focus on outstanding projects greater than 6 months and with a slower than average turn-around time.

Future enhancements are planned that would allow contractors to adjust their ability to accept customers themselves.

2-4 Unit/Vacant Unit Process Reminder

### **Application Submission for Multifamily with 2-4 Units**

- Complete and signed application submitted for each unit along with:
  - Completed Landlord Agreements and Proof of Homeownership
  - Income documentation
- 50% rule
  - If 50% or more units qualify under Tier 1, then remaining units will qualify as Tier 1 and no income documentation will be necessary; conversely this applies for Tier 3 as well
    - Letter can be uploaded to income documentation section indicating unit qualifies under 50% rule
- Vacant Units
  - Landlords can submit applications for vacant units following same rules as occupied units (meeting income guidelines or qualifying under 50% rule)

## **OTDA HEAP Award Letter Process**

### **OTDA HEAP Award Letter Process**

- Accepting applications for when funding becomes available
  - HEAP Award Letters must be dated for on or after October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023
  - Submit completed application as you normally would
    - Applications will be placed on hold while NYSERDA waits for confirmation from OTDA that recipient qualifies for the additional OTDA incentive
      - Please allow extra time for this process
        - If confirmed applicant will be notified of incentive amount (program team will determine funding amounts)
        - If not approved applicant will qualify for typical Tier 1 incentives of up to \$10k (less any prior incentives used within the last 3 years)
  - Please note that this is not offered year-round there is a window of opportunity each year based on funding

## **New Data Collection Forms**

### **New Data Collection Forms**

Contractors have requested data collection forms that have the data fields that are in NYHEP. Working with the BPCA, NYSERDA has created a single one page form available both as a Word Doc and a fillable PDF that can serve as a data collection form during an assessment. We have also produced a Excel spreadsheet that lists every data point in NYHEP if a contractor would like to use this information to create their own data collection page.

These forms are generated to help contractors collect data and their use is not required by the program.
